



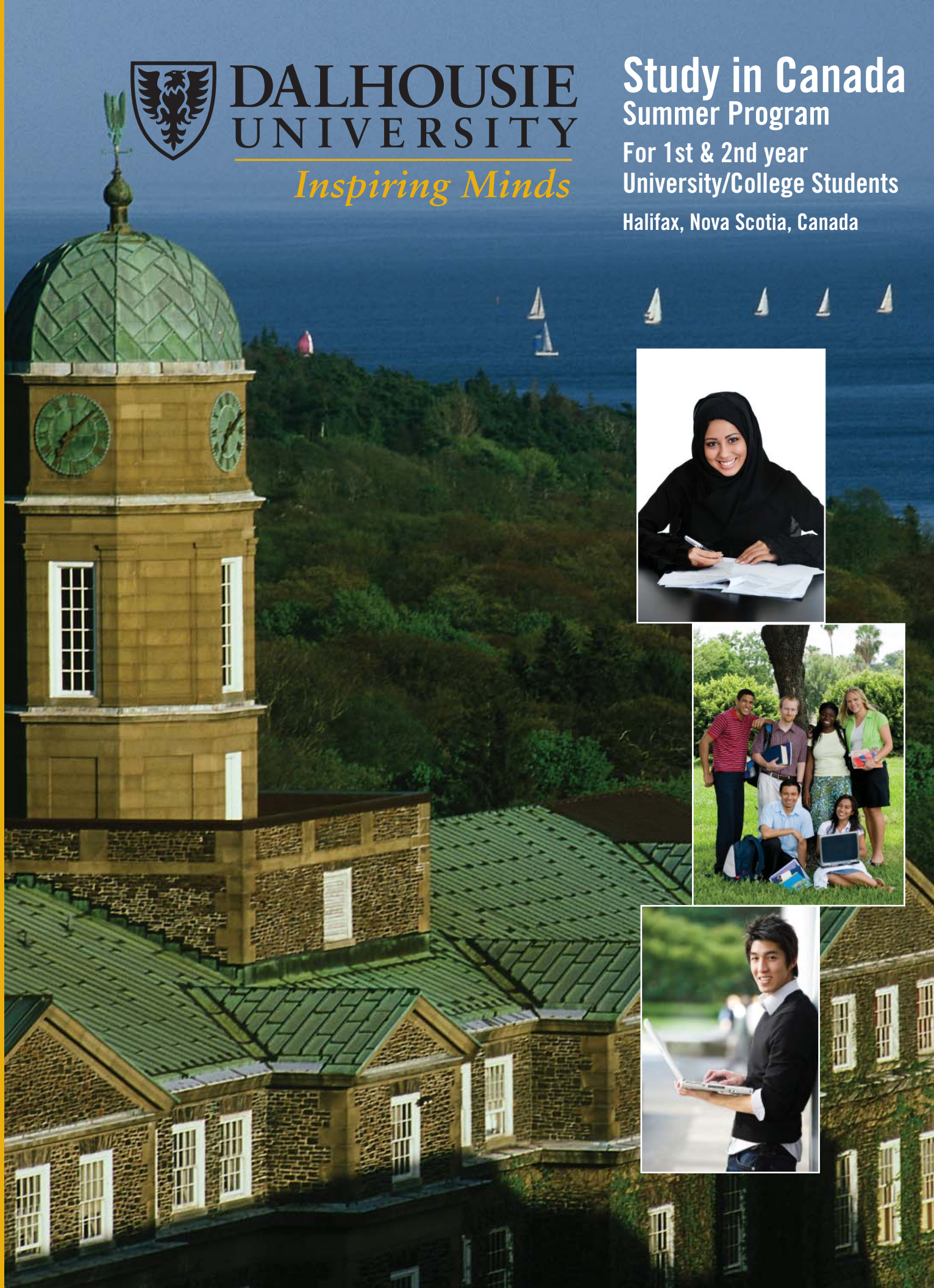

Program Description

Mornings focus on improving English skills in speaking, listening, reading, writing and vocabulary development. Afternoon activities give the students a variety of opportunities to explore the diversity of our campus and community, participate in hands-on demonstrations in health sciences, business, entrepreneurship, engineering, sustainability, computer science, science and practice English outside of the classroom. The real strength of the program comes from analyzing their time abroad and understanding how to make an impact in the communities where they live.

Our Instructors

Dalhousie University College of Continuing Education has a talented team of ESL instructors. Each member brings a solid background of education and training (graduate level) as well as real world experience to help students develop their language skills. Instructors have a minimum of 5 years experience in teaching academic English in the university environment as well as having international teaching experience.

To complement the ESL team, students will learn alongside internationally recognized faculty members. Faculty will help students analyze their world from a broader perspective and make essential contributions that enrich the student learning experience.

- 9:00 Reading skills - skimming, scanning, reading for details, oral reporting
- 10:00 Break
- 10:15 Listening skills - listening for details, note-taking, oral reporting
- 11:15 Writing skills - grammar, paragraph and essay structure, journal writing
- 12:00 Class ends

- Tuesday Canadian society and history themes
- Wednesday Hands-on demonstrations at research and innovation centers
- Thursday Social and cultural activities
- Friday Free time



Excursions and Activities

We believe that cultural and recreational activities are important to support the curriculum and to encourage interaction and teamwork among the participants. Cultural and recreational activities are designed to stimulate spontaneous expression in the second language. These activities may include visits to the museums, Nova Scotia Legislature building, business sector, science labs, strawberry picking, Peggy's Cove, historical and musical events, and sports activities such as soccer. Preparation for and reporting on these activities will be incorporated into the curriculum.
